Letter from the Executive Director

Dear AETH Community.

As we come to the close of another remarkable year, I write with deep gratitude and joy for all that we have accomplished en conjunto. This 2025 has been a year of vision, collaboration, and tangible impact; a testament to what happens when we unite to elevate the excellence of Hispanic theological education. We celebrated several historic milestones that mark a new season of growth and influence for AETH:

- We launched our new website and exclusive membership portal, creating a digital home for our members and partners to connect, learn, and grow.
- We inaugurated our new Capacity Building Program, through which more than 20 Bible Institutes received over a quarter of a million dollars in microgrants in our first cohort, strengthening grassroots theological education where it matters most.
- We published three significant works that enrich theological reflection: Antología: Generación tras Generación, Manual de Storytelling, and the E-Book Hermenéutica Intercultural.
- We launched our new podcast, ECOS de AETH, as part of our Antioquía Program in partnership with Candler School of Theology, amplifying the voices and wisdom of our community in nontraditional ways.
- We held our 8th Justo and Catherine González Resource Center Lecture Series in San Dimas, CA, gathering nearly 200 participants from 7 countries, 18 states, and 41 organizations, a historic moment of dialogue, inspiration, and hope.

 In coordination with the Lilly Endowment, we launched the new National Hispanic Initiative to Strengthen Pastoral Leadership and Congregations, in collaboration with Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, a pioneering effort that positions AETH as a key collaborator in shaping the future of theological formation across the nation.

Each of these achievements bears witness to the transformative power of collective commitment. They reflect not only organizational progress but also the creativity, faith, and resilience of our entire network, members, staff, leaders, institutions, and friends who believe in the sacred task of forming leaders for the Church and the world.

As we look toward 2026, we reaffirm our commitment to advancing a mission-focused, community-rooted, and excellence-driven theological education. Together, we will continue to nurture the next generation of pastors, educators, and leaders who embody the richness of our heritage and the promise of our future. I invite you to read this new ECOS edition so you can be up to date with more details of our work for you, the church and the academic community.







Abstract:

Theological libraries are confronting the challenge of resourcing multilingual and longdistance programs. This essay focuses particularly on Hispanic/Latino programs in seminaries in the US, drawing from the history of advocacy from Hispanic/Latino scholars for systemic changes in theological libraries' approach to servicing these programs. Rather than focusing solely on how to find resources, the essay advocates for a comprehensive approach to serve the needs of Hispanic/Latino students at theological seminaries.

Announcement: Call for Applications for the Second Cohort of the Capacity Development Project for Bible Institutes (Year 3 - 2026)

Dear AETH members and directors of Bible institutes:

We are pleased to announce the upcoming opening of the Requests for Proposals (RFP) and applications for the second cohort of our **Capacity Building for Bible Institutes** project. This five-year project seeks to strengthen the administrative, management, and pedagogical capacity of the institutes, either for the purpose of achieving certification standards or for boosting their internal mission.

The official call for applications for Year 3 activities (2026), which constitute Cohort 2 for various areas of the project, will begin in **January 2026**.

PROJECT FOCAL POINTS:

The project covers three main areas of development:



Leadership Course for Churches and Bible Institutes: An online course is offered that culminates in a certificate.



Capacity Development Micro-grants: Institutes that successfully complete the leadership course may apply for grants for essential purposes such as:

- Acquisition of software and library resources.
- Hiring curricular consultants and board development.
- Specialized training in leadership, management, or support for the certification verification process.
- The selection of cohorts of 25 participating institutes is planned annually.



Instructor Training (Teacher to Teacher): A program focused on andragogy/pedagogy, curriculum design, critical thinking, theological reflection, and project-based learning. Participants commit to replicating the training with at least five other instructors at their institute.

Directors, rectors, and instructors are urged to stay tuned for AETH communications for details on the application process and specific start dates for the 2026 programs.


CELEBRATION OF MAÑANA'S THIRTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY:





The LS25 – Justo & Catherine González Lecture Series became a historic gathering for our Hispanic and Latino theological community. Over three days, more than 191 participants and 261 registered attendees from 18 U.S. states and several countries in Latin America and the Caribbean came together to explore the central theme: Preaching and Migration: Identity, Trauma, and Technique. Pastors, scholars, ministry leaders, and students took part in keynote lectures, workshops, intergenerational conversations, and worship spaces that affirmed our diversity, our hope, and the theological vitality of our people. The presence of 41 academic institutions and an impressive denominational breadth created a true mosaic of perspectives that enriched every dialogue.

Beyond the sessions, panels, and workshops, what truly touched our hearts were the voices of those who participated. Here are some of their most powerful expressions.

IDENTITY AND CALLING: GOD SEES US

"How we see others matters because that's how we end up seeing ourselves."

"We have a God who sees us and restores our dignity."

"Affirming our identity as women in Christ, created by God."

HEALING AND TRAUMA: BREAKING THE SILENCE

"One of the most important takeaways was remembering the children when preparing a lesson."

"We need to understand the curriculum based on the age of those we serve."

"The importance of breaking the silence and sharing trauma in order to heal."

PREACHING AND TECHNIQUE: MESSAGES THAT REACH

"The pastor's audience is the humanity of the people sitting in front of them."

"We need all kinds of messages, embodied in the needs of the context, to reach multiple generations."

REFLECTIONS ON THE EVENT: A FAITH THAT EMBRACES PAIN AND REALITY

"The theology of suffering was eye-opening for me; our God suffers and weeps with us."

"Trauma has a lot to do with how people think... Some are in denial, some are anxious and depressed. But we still need to speak the truth about injustice with care."

"This is a truly historic moment. We must include themes that speak to the present, even as the Latino church faces internal division."

"The most important idea when addressing issues of belonging, language, and culture is to understand the environment where the lesson will be taught."

The Church and Love

1 John 4:9-12, NKJV (excerpted)

"In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world ... Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another ... If we love one another, God abides in us, and His love has been perfected in us."

Advent teaches us to wait with anticipation. It also teaches us about God's eternal and unconditional love for humanity. The season reveals the mystery of incarnation: God's love became visible in Jesus. And now, that same love becomes visible through the Church. Expressing more than mere feelings and sentiments, Christ dwells with us in our struggles, in our hopes, and even in our waiting. God's love assures us that we are not alone. But that same love confronts us as well.

The Church cannot reduce love to sentiment or speech. Love must be evident in action. The Church is called to embody love that feeds the hungry, welcomes the stranger, and resists injustice. In a world that too often divides and excludes, Advent love beckons us to become a people who live out God's love in community.

This Advent season, may the Church be a sign of love incarnate, a comfort to the weary, and a holy confrontation to all that dehumanizes life.
